T Dear Murphy First,

During the last week of January, I did something I've never done before—well, 2 things really. 1) With the support of SPPRC (and a lot of help from worship and ministry leaders!), I took 1 week of Spiritual Renewal Leave—thank you! 2) I filled that time with a beginner clawhammer banjo class at the John C. Campbell Folk School.

At the closing ceremony for the week, our class got on stage and played one of the songs we'd been learning. Afterward, someone said what happened up there was somewhat of a miracle. A miracle because there were 15 banjos all playing the same song in rhythm with each other and (more or less) in tune! The same song. In rhythm. In tune.

Another way of saying that is, we were all on the same page.

We hope for that same sort of "miracle" with what we're about as a church. That's a big reason we went through a visioning process at the end of 2022—to get clear on who we are (what's our story?), what we're about (our mission), and what's most important right now.

I'm so thankful for everyone's involvement during those three months of meetings and conversation. It kept in the front of my mind what a remarkable congregation this is, and what an exciting season we are in!

One of the outcomes of that process—from listening to everyone's feedback and ideas—was writing a one page document that summarized all of our work. On that document (shared in this newsletter) you'll find statements of Mission, Vision, Values, our Tagline, Primary Neighbors (to be in ministry with), and Strategic Objectives, as well as a Foundational Scripture that ties it all together.

At our January 30th Administrative Council meeting, we voted to adopt this for Murphy FUMC. This document isn't just a nice page we'll tuck in a binder. It's something that we'll be referring to as a way of guiding our priorities, decision-making, and where we focus energy and resources. It's something we can point to and say, "This is who we are."

Now, there's lots to "unpack" in each statement, and we'll take time to do that over the next several months. But let me give you one example of how these statements describe who we already are.

We are saying our mission is "to live as a community transformed by God's grace, sent to love and serve like Jesus." On Sunday January 29, we heard from several church members about some "lightbulb moments" in their life of faith. These were stories about how God put a light on the path and showed them the way—sometimes a new way! I heard in each of their stories how they experienced transformation by God's grace. AND how that transformation then meant they were sent to love and serve like Jesus.

I'm excited for this moment at Murphy FUMC, and for our next steps together. And I'm grateful to be with you.

In our newsletter look out for information about events and offerings related to the start of Lent, including a really fun dinner on "Shrove Tuesday," 2/21!






