T Dear Murphy First,

Holy Week is upon us. For plenty of people, it's just a week. Or the week before spring break.

Or the last minute to get taxes done.

For us, we call this week "holy." Why? This week is different from others because we are invited to stay near to Jesus in these moments that are so rich and sacred, so holy. The worship services this week are among my favorite throughout the whole year. The stories, and ways we reenact them, are so profound. They hardly need interpreting, just re-telling. And they are best told and heard together.

I once participated in a service called the Great Easter Vigil, a service that once was common for all Christians, but has lately fallen off. Maybe because it lasted 4 hours long. It was 4 hours of telling the stories of God's mighty deeds of salvation throughout history, singing, enacting the story. About half-way through, I realized what we were doing. We weren't anonymous worshippers who happened to be in the same place following the directions in the bulletin. We were a family, gathered together, telling stories. Remembering, Laughing, Crying, Hoping.

That is what we do during these services during Holy Week. Here is the schedule:

- 4/6 Maundy Thursday service at 7pm
- 4/7 Cross Walk (starting at St. William Catholic Church) 10am; Community Good Friday service at 12pm
- 4/9 Sunrise Service (Harshaw Chapel) at 7am; NEW Breakfast (Fellowship Hall) at 9:45am; Easter Worship at 11am

If there's ever a time for God's family to be gathered together, this is it. I hope you'll join us for these Holy Week and Easter services.

In the newsletter, you'll find lots of other important information about things coming up in April. Some are now part of our annual rhythm, like Service Sunday on 4/23 and Picnic on the Grounds (at Harshaw Chapel) on 4/29. Others are new, like the carwash fundraiser on 4/29 to help send kids to Camp Tekoa this summer.

As we head into Holy Week and April, I hope we can keep reflecting on how we live into who we are as a church—a congregation that's all about Relationships, Hospitality, Service, Faithfulness, and Generosity.



### **Preschool Cohort**

Friends, as we start our 101st year in downtown Murphy, one of the things we said we want to give time, energy, and resources to is considering how we can be part of a solution for affordable childcare/preschool in our area.



Back in January, we were accepted into the NC Rural Center's "Community Connect Program" in order to explore that very thing. It is an 18-month long program and guided process that comes with an up-to \$50k grant. Our "Community Connect" team includes: Monica Matthews, Bridget Esterhuizen, Sue Bell, Marji Hill, Pastor Wil, Sylvia McLaurin, Amanda McGee, and Jessica Avett. Each person brings unique perspective and experience to the conversation.

We have already identified that there is no such thing as "the need." There are multiple and varied needs for childcare and preschool in our area. One way we see FUMC potentially providing a solution is by opening a part-time, 3-day/week preschool. We are still very much in the exploring and brainstorming phase.

Please pray for this effort! We know—from data and personal experience—how great the needs are, and see this as a way to be part of the solution in a way that fits who we are and what resources we have.

Starting even a part-time preschool will mean making adjustments with how we use certain spaces. I've heard many, proud stories about how we used to have a kindergarten and pre-

school at our church. Perhaps the Lord will open the door for that to happen again!?


Stay tuned for updates, and stay in prayer as we proceed.

\*Our initial goal was to start small with a monthly Parent's Morning Out, but the group who explored that goal decided we needed a consistent nursery worker who can keep kids (with the help of volunteers), and coordinate the event. That is on hold while we keep looking for nursery help.



### The Wesley Ringers will be playing hand bells during Holy Week. These are the pieces you will be hearing.

A Day to Rejoice (Palm Sunday). "Triumphal entry" are two word that often describe Jesus' arrival on the occasion we call Palm Sunday. This rhythmic piece is certainly joyful! The composer, Michael Mazzatenta, is a music professor as well as organist at First UMC in Corpus Christi, TX. The music features percussive sounds, not just the reverberating bells you expect from the Wesley Ringers. One technique the ringers use is



When I Survey the Wondrous Cross (Palm Sunday). One scholar claims that Charles Wesley, who wrote over 6,000 hymns, once said he would have given up all 6,000+ if he could have written just this one: "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" (text by Isaac Watts; tune by Lowell Mason), #299 in our hymnal. There would seem to be no higher compliment! Watts' verses of text comprise very complicated theology, and Mason's tune traces back centuries to Gregorian chant. For the ringers, the challenge lies in serenely playing the mind-boggling four key changes.

**Beneath the Cross of Jesus** (Good Friday). Elizabeth Clephane, a frail and short-lived Scottish woman, wrote the text of this hymn and several others but was best known in her time for living a life of service, giving away all she could to the poor. Her lyric (UMH #297) expresses the comfort and shelter that she associated with the cross. In this arrangement, the windchimes and random ringing of the smallest bells create an almost supernatural quality while the middle and lower bells sing the tranquil melody. At the end, when the windchimes return, there is the slightest hint of Easter: five low hand chime tones deliberately ascend stepwise, as if to sing "Jesus will arise."

**Crown Him with Many Crowns** (Easter). The tune of this Easter hymn (UMH #327), called Diademata, appears in our hymnal four times, but the Easter lyrics are the ones sung most often. The tune was first published in 1868; it is a forward-driving, marching one. Sometimes the listener will hear some bells ring out the melody while others accompany it with marching, xylophone-like tones by leaving their bells on the table and striking them with mallets. At other times, the melody rings out in the middle bells while upper ringers create an echo effect by lightly reverberating their bells downward onto the table and then up again. The ringers wear many little hats. The risen Christ wears all the crowns.


