Dear Murphy First,

Back in February I wrote about being on the "same page." Being on the same page is a phrase I hear used all over the place—in musical ensembles, choirs, sports teams, construction crews. We know what it means: everyone working together toward the same goal.

For us that means being on the same page with where we're putting our energy, effort, and resources for ministry. To help in that, during our visioning process we wrote out (and adopted) the "one pager" that has our mission, vision, core values, tagline, and strategic objectives for the next 2-3 years.

For me, it's important to remember that this wasn't a way of saying much that was new. We named what is already true about who we are, and how we can take the next right steps to be more of who God wants us to be and how God is leading us in mission.

This isn't just a nice set of ideas we'll tuck away in a folder or slap on a website. It'll drive our priorities and decisions. For instance, one of our main objectives is to "optimize staff and space for ministry with children, youth, and young families." That's why the #1 priority for SPPRC is hiring Nursery Workers and a Family Ministries Director. Our vision is to "build communities of hope where all people experience belonging and abundant life." That's why a top priority for Trustees is finishing the Community Room (below the sanctuary) where various groups are meeting every week.

Each week during the season of Lent, in my preaching, I'm looking at each of our core values through the lens of the life and teachings of Jesus as recorded by Matthew. Those values are:

- ⇒ Relationships
- ⇒ Hospitality
- ⇒ Generosity
- ⇒ Faithfulness
- ⇒ Service

These are values that get to the "core" of who we already are. They are our bread and butter. And we want to purposefully lean into them in everything we do.

I find our vision to be especially compelling: "to build communities of hope where all people experience belonging and abundant life." Isn't that what people are looking for?


Dear Friends,






