Dear Murphy First,

You've heard me talk and seen me write about the visioning work we did as a congregation a few months ago. In fact, during Lent, I preached on our 5 Core Values—Relationships, Hospitality, Service, Faithfulness, and Generosity. You're going to start seeing our mission and vision statements showing up on bulletins and newsletters.

Since the get-go, I said the point of all that wasn't to create a nice document with bold statements that would sit on a shelf. That would be a waste. Instead, the idea was to discern how God is leading us into our 101st year in downtown Murphy. How can we be more of who we are? Who is God leading us to be in ministry with?

The idea was (is!) whatever we landed on would guide our decision-making, focus our energy, and rally us together. The idea is, the outcomes would actually determine ministry.

Here's a snapshot of how we're putting into action the things we talked about:

- One strategic objective is to optimize staff and space for ministry with children, youth, and young families—SPPRC has been working diligently to fill our nursery worker positions and the Family Ministries Director. As of now, we have 2 new nursery workers: Patti and Mary hooray!!! The Trustees have been working to get the Community Room more fully operational—and this space has already been a huge blessing to community groups, including many programs centering around children and families.
- Another strategic objective is to experiment with solutions for families needing childcare. We have a diverse group of folks in a program through the NC Rural Center doing just that! In fact, the team is working on a plan for what it would look like for FUMC to start a part-time preschool. If it comes together this would mean some rearranging and adjustments. Please keep this initiative in your prayers and stay tuned for updates!
- Another goal is having regular intergenerational service projects. This falls under the objective of sharing stories and connecting across generations. Service Sunday was a great example of that coming to life, as will be some upcoming service projects with Alpha and in VBS.

What I want you to see is that we're taking action. We didn't go through some motions in order to say, "Well, we got through that." We're trying to live into the vision of "building communities of hope where all people experience belonging and abundant life."




COUNTERS & OFFICE VOLUNTEERS & CHILDREN'S VOLUNTEERS

Experimenting with solutions for families needing childcare.

At our meeting this past month, we reviewed results from a simple survey we had distributed to different groups via email, and it confirmed what we thought—there is strong interest in our area for both preschool and child care. With this validation in mind, we set some goals, some objectives and some tasks. We hope to present a clear and concise plan to the Finance Committee, the SPPRC Committee, and the Administrative Council at their meetings in May and June.

The consensus is to start small by offering a part-time 3-day/week preschool for 3-5 year old children, based on a Montessori model. The questions we are still exploring are:

- FUMC insurance policy impacts
- FUMC budget impacts
- · Costs for furnishings and equipment
- Usage of campus spaces
- Program legal, fiscal and reporting structure
- Program core values
- Program tuition and fee structure

We hope that this program will be able to grow, either on our own campus, or as a model for other local churches to pursue. Our desire is to serve as many children and families as God makes possible for us, in whatever ways we can.



Please pray for this effort! We know—from data and personal experience—how great the needs are, and see this as a way to be part of the solution in a way that fits who we are and what resources we have. Starting even a part-time preschool will mean making adjustments with how we use certain spaces, so we are asking everyone to be flexible and keep open hearts and minds as we try to work out the best arrangements for everyone.




WILLING HANDS on the go:


