Dear Murphy First,

In last month's article, I shared some notes about progress we're making on our church's vision and goals, including the hiring of new nursery workers! We're thrilled to have Mary Lee, Patty Singer, and Marlene Gray on staff with us, and Ellie Martin as a summer nursery worker.

Related to another goal, on Sunday, June 25 you heard about how Soul Table has been awarded a grant through the United Methodist Appalachian Ministries Network (UMAMN). That grant will help Soul Table expand to two times a month.

This month, I want to share with you some more progress on another of our goals. At our June Administrative Council meeting, the Council approved moving forward with starting a part-time, Montessori-based preschool at Murphy FUMC! This came directly out of our goals of experimenting with solutions for families needing childcare and optimizing space and staff for ministry with children, youth, and young families.

I've put together a brief Preschool FAQ that's also included in this newsletter, but wanted to take a few minutes to share what I think is special about all of this:

One of the things I've tried to learn to do in ministry is pay attention to what picture is emerging when the Spirit starts putting puzzle pieces on the table. Usually it means God is up to something!

God's been putting pieces of this puzzle on the table for a while now. Here's what I mean:

- Over the last few years, I've heard from people inside our church and in our community wondering about what it would look like for FUMC to start a preschool.
- During our visioning process, you all confirmed what I've seen and heard for the last 5 years: FUMC has a heart for kids and wants to serve our community, so we set a goal for experimenting with child-care solutions for young families.
- At the same time, we were invited to apply for and were accepted into a program through the NC Rural Center to help us address a community challenge and an up-to \$50,000 grant. (Can you see how dots were starting to connect?)
- And at the same time, we have had a couple of outstanding women (Bridget Esterhuizen and Monica Matthews) connecting with the church in different ways, both of whom happen to have teaching certifications, experience with Montessori teaching, and their finger on the pulse of preschool and childcare need in our area. (Now bells are going off, right?)

Can you see the picture taking shape?!

Now, none of that is to say that things have been effortless and that we don't have our work cut out for us. This is a big undertaking. But when the Spirit starts putting pieces together, we do well to take notice, and ask for the faith and courage to take that bold next step.

Stay tuned, ask questions, join with us in prayer, and let's keep journeying together in the future God has for us!

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

O R The **2023 Western North Carolina Conference** was a wonderful weekend filled with God's grace, the opportunity to connect with one another and with God, and the holiness of our commitment to love God and one another. Below are some highlights of our time together in holy conferencing.

The Annual Conference:

1. **Commissioned** 16 Emerging Community Pastors, recognized 86 Lighthouse Churches,



- 2. **Committed** ourselves to be a Church that welcomes anyone and everyone: welcoming immigrants; reckoning with the realities of racism; developing a more strategic response to strengthen the Black church; honoring the faith of people across the political aisle from wherever we are sitting; and including LGBTQIA+ persons in all aspects of the life of our church. We also heard witnesses from those who are offering ministry through storytelling, hosting diversity conversations in rural contexts, and church planting in digital spaces.
- 3. **Ordained**, commissioned, and licensed 29 clergy for ministry in local churches and extension ministries and commissioned a deaconess for ministry. The service concluded with an invitation to clergy to renew their vows of ordination, and a number of persons stepped forward to explore a call to ministry.
- 4. **Passed** two creation care resolutions, which asked each church to make this ministry one of their priorities and urged our denomination to add fossil fuels to the filters for responsible investing; elected three new lay delegates to the 2024 Jurisdictional Conference; and learned about the Western North Carolina Conference's role in co-hosting with the North Carolina Conference, the 2024 General Conference next year in Charlotte.
- 5. **Communicated** a consistent focus on grace, connection and holiness as our pathways to healing in the midst of a difficult season in our nation and in our communities. The Bible Study focused on the great commandments of Jesus (Matthew 22) and the great commission (Matthew 28). Bishop Carter preached on holiness as love of God and neighbor and the closing service included prayers and anointing for healing for lay and clergy leaders returning to their communities.
- 6. **Received** an offering of almost \$50,000 which will help to plant new churches in Ukraine and in areas of Europe where Ukrainians are living as refugees, and which will train laity and clergy in response to trauma in our communities. We also approved a budget that represents a 2% decrease in the conference and general church apportionment to each local church.
- 7. **Announced** the appointment of pastors to our 757 churches and extension ministers to chaplaincy, campus ministry, community development, higher education, justice and mercy ministries, and missionary service; commissioned the district superintendents as missional strategists for the coming year; experienced inspiring worship and beautiful music; and left with a renewed sense of identity as a people called to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the 44 western countries of Western North Carolina and beyond.



Preschool FAQ

Where will it be located? In the Community Room (beneath the Sanctuary). This room has been many things in FUMC's history—Sharing Center, youth center, fellowship hall, and kindergarten/preschool. This space is ideal for a Montessori-based program and allows us to serve the most kids/families, and does not impact offices or other routine operations.

What are the days/times of operation? It will be 3-days/week, 3.5hrs/day.

Who will it serve? Children 3-6yrs old. It will be available to families in the church and wider community. The preschool plans to have "scholarship" or needs-based spots available in order to provide a high quality education to kids who otherwise might not have that opportunity.

How much will it cost? \$250/month, which is comparable to other similar programs in our area.

When will it start? Our goal is to start within a month of the start of Cherokee County Schools. There are several factors at play, including work in the room, ironing out details of the program, advertising and enrolling. We agree that a good start is more important than a fixed timeline.

Why only part-time? In our own research and research we accessed through larger agencies, we learned that there are multiple needs related to childcare and preschool in our area. Part-time preschool is a clearly identified need, and is a place where we as a church are suited to step in and meet a need.

What does that mean for space? The Preschool will take up most of the Community Room, but there will be a portion that is available to adult use at non-school operating times. Handbell and Choir rooms are unaffected. It's great that more and more groups are using church spaces; it also means it's increasingly important that all events/meetings get scheduled through the church office.

How will it be funded? Grant funding will help with start-up costs and material/training purchases. As it gets underway, student tuition will make the school be a self-supporting ministry of Murphy FUMC. It's likely we'll have a Preschool fundraiser as part of our annual rhythm. Donations to help with scholarship slots are always welcome!

Who will oversee it? The Preschool will be run by a Lead and Assistant Teacher. They will be employees of the church, and report to a Preschool Committee appointed by Admin Council, including a representative from SPPRC, Trustees, Finance, Pastor, a preschool parent, and other members as needed.

What can we do? Pray! This is a big undertaking, and it is one we believe is right in line with God's vision for Murphy FUMC. We ask everyone to be praying for the Preschool and the potential kids/families blessed by its existence. If you want to make a donation to support the preschool, that is another great way to help get the school going and help us offer scholarship slots.

The Trustees continue to work toward improving the church buildings. In June, a group of volunteers helped clean the church and trim the front bushes. Diane Barfield organized the event. The front of the church was pressure-washed, walls were cleaned, the sanctuary wood was polished, windows and doors were cleaned of mold and insect nests, handrails were scraped in preparation for painting. The weather was horrible with pouring rain, but the volunteers pushed through. HUGE thanks to everyone who came and helped. You really put faith into action! There will be more projects in the future with plenty of opportunities to volunteers.

The Trustees are also getting quotes from electricians, contractors, painters and construction experts in order to repair and bring the sanctuary building up to modern safety codes.




