Dear Murphy First,

It's been almost 12 months now since we embarked on the journey to the Bible in a year! Can you believe it? We've covered a lot of ground, told lots of stories, asked lots of questions, and laid a foundation for how we meet God through Scripture, and how these sacred words are for the transformation of our heart and life.

I keep joking with our Wednesday Bible study group that there'll be a test on our last day of the study. There won't be any test, but I think it is worth taking time to review what we've learned. Some of the key ideas I hoped to have shared throughout our study this year are:

- The Bible is not primarily about what, why, when, or how. It is about Who. Who is God, who are we.
- We are made in the image of God, to imitate God, in the mission of God.
- The Bible is a window into the heart of God, not a weapon to wield against others.
- We are invited to search the scriptures for the sake of transformation (of heart and life), not gathering information.
- The message we have heard from the beginning is: God is love; love one another.
- The Bible is meant to be read, understood, and lived in community with one another.

I wonder: what have been some of your big takeaways from our year in the Bible together?

I know I have plenty of other things that have stuck in my mind and heart. I've been blessed by being part of a weekly Bible study where our collective wisdom is greater than any of us would have on our own. We've encouraged each other, opened each others' minds, and encountered God in new ways.

As The Bible Year is ending, there are new groups forming. A mid-week Bible study on Reclaiming The Wesley's Vision will be starting soon, and the Sunday morning Seeker's class will be studying Becoming Everyday Missionaries. Our children's Godly Play Sunday school class and young parent's class will start back up on 9/14.

One thing I've learned from experience, and through our study of the Bible, is that being part of a small group –whether in study, service, singing, etc. – is a significant part of 1. Growing in our faith, and 2. Really being part of a community.

If you don't already have a group you are part of, I hope you'll find one to jump in with this fall.


There are more detail jobs to be done once that's finished in order to get the Chapel back in order to host services and events—like painting, interior detail work, and putting furniture back in place.

CHRISTMAS BOXES FOR PROJECT AGAPE



AGAPE = American Greater Armenian Partnership Efforts

Project AGAPE, a ministry to Armenia, is a collaborative effort of the North Carolina and the Western North Carolina Conferences of The United Methodist Church in a joint effort with the Armenian Apostolic Church.

As you may or may not know, the Western North Carolina and North Carolina Conferences formed a partnership with the Armenian Apostolic Church in Armenia during the 1990's to help support its missions and ministries. Out of this effort came Project AGAPE, Inc. This ministry serves the Kashatagh region, the sole humanitarian aid partnership licensed by the Republic of Artsakh (Nagorno-Karaakh) government. Long-standing, multi-layered conflict prevents any other humanitarian group from working with the people of this area, who struggle with this way of life. In more than two decades of ministry, Project AGAPE has shared the love of Christ by continuing early projects and adopting new efforts for and with the people of Armenia and Artsakh, as this ministry serves those in Kashatagh and border villages.

As a part of this effort, Willing Hands of UWFaith and our church family have tried to provide Christmas ShoeBoxes for the Armenian children each year in the fall. Due to Covid and major unrest and fighting in their region, we have not been able to do this for several years. We are going to do Christmas ShoeBoxes again this year and hope that many of our church family will feel led to participate in this exercise. On the next page are copies of the instruction sheets for creating boxes for boys and girls from the age of infant to 18. You can prepare one box or several and pick the age and gender you would like to provide for. We will collect these Christmas ShoeBoxes from August 31st thru September 7th. Pastor Wil is going to bless these on the 7th, and then we will transport them to another location in North Carolina for processing and shipping.

We Americans are so blessed to live in a country where all people have the chance to succeed in life. This effort gives us an opportunity to provide for children elsewhere in the world who do not have a stable life.

CONTINUING OUR STUDIES...




The audience: Anyone who would like to better understand the beginnings of Methodism and how they influence our worship today.




Our Fellowship Luncheons begin again in September. Missions Committee will be hosting the one on September 21st as part of our ZOE Sunday celebration. JOIN US!




